The musical follows head-strong matchmaker, Dolly Galagher-Levi in her pursuit to find a match for New York City millionaire, Horace Vandergelder. Put on Your Sunday Clothes takes place as each character prepares to take the train into the city. Some are looking for love, while others are ready to explore the great beyond.

Simple Joys of Maidenhood

Camelot

Simple Joys of Maidenhood is from the 1960 musical, *Camelot* with book and lyrics by Alan Jay Lerner and music by Frederick Lowe. The musical is based on the legend of King Arthur, and is further adapted from the novel The Once and Future King, by T.H. White. In Simple Joys of Maidenhood, Guenevere, a young woman betrothed to Arthur, has escaped into the woods. She laments her destiny, wishing to instead live life as a simple maiden, rather than become a queen.

Tom, Dick, or Harry

Kiss Me, Kate

Tom, Dick, or Harry is from the musical *Kiss Me, Kate* written in 1948 by Bella and Samuel Spewack, with music and lyrics by Cole Porter. This story portrays the production of a musical version of Shakespeare's Taming of the Shrew. In this song, Bianca, the Daughter of Baptista and sister of Katherine, is being chased by three young suitors. Bianca would happily marry any of the men, but is not permitted to until her shrewish older sister marries first.

On the Street Where You Live

My Fair Lady

On the Street Where You Live is from the musical *My Fair Lady*. My Fair Lady is written by Alan Jay Lerner with music by Frederick Lowe. The musical, based on the play Pygmalion, follows the Cockney Eliza Doolittle as she takes speech lessons so that she may pass as a lady. In this song, Freddy has just been captivated by the cockney girl and declares that he will wait for her outside, on the street where she lives.

Marry the Man Today

Guys and Dolls

Marry the Man Today is from the musical *Guys and Dolls*, with music and lyrics by Frank Loesser and book by Jo Swerling and Abe Burrows based on two short stories by Damon Runyon. It tells the overlapping stories of high-roller Sky Masterson, who falls in love with mission worker Sarah Brown, and lovable rapscallion Nathan Detroit, engaged for 14 years to Miss Adelaide, a headliner at the Hot Box Club. Sarah and Adelaide are currently unhappy with their men, commiserate, but then come to the conclusion that they may as well marry the men now, and reform their ways later.

C'est Moi Camelot

C'est Moi! is from the 1960 musical, *Camelot* with book and lyrics by Alan Jay Lerner and music by Frederick Lowe. The musical is based on the legend of King Arthur, and is further adapted from the novel The Once and Future King, by T.H. White. Sir Lancelot du Lac has just found out King Arthur is recruiting knights for his Round Table, and believes that he is a French Pillar of Excellence.

In Glitter and Be Gay, Candide's lover, Cunegonde relishes in her jewels, despite being captured from her home and taken away to Paris...believing her sweet Candide to be dead.

In this number, Ilona is being seduced by Steven Kodaly, only to be ditched by Kodaly immediately following.

Lily's Eyes

The Secret Garden

Lily's Eyes is from the 1989 musical *The Secret Garden*, based on the 1911 novel of the same name. This early 20th Century story follows an orphaned young girl as she goes to live with her brooding uncle Archibald in Yorkshire. In this song, Archibald and his manipulative brother Neville grieve the loss of Archibald's wife Lily, and it is revealed that Neville also had romantic feelings for his brother's wife.

Matchmaker

Fiddler on the Roof

Matchmaker, Matchmaker is from the 1964 musical, *Fiddler on the Roof*. The show tells the story of Tevye, a Jewish milkman from the village of Anatevka, and his five daughters. Tevye and his wife Golde, are staples in the community, and oftentimes find themselves guiding others through life. In Matchmaker, Matchmaker, the three eldest daughters: Tzeitel, Hodel and Chava, marvel over the town matchmaker, Yente, and her mission to give every eligible girl the "perfect match".

Where is The Life That Late I Led?

Kiss Me. Kate

Where is the Life That Late I Led? is from the musical Kiss Me, Kate written in 1948 by Bella and Samuel Spewack, with music and lyrics by Cole Porter. This story portrays the production of a musical version of Shakespeare's Taming of the Shrew. Petruchio is betrothed to Katherine, daughter of the wealthy Baptista. Petruchio is marrying purely for the family wealth, and in this song, is mourning the loss of his bachelor days.

The Next Time It Happens

Pipe Dream

The Next Time It Happens is from the 1955 musical, *Pipe Dream*, by Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein II. Pipe Dream centers around the budding romance between a marine biologist named Doc and a prostitute named Suzy. The Next Time It Happens takes place after Doc and Suzy find themselves confused as to what they want in a relationship, Doc attempts to apologize to Suzy by visiting her in the abandoned boiler she calls come. After he leaves, Suzy ponders their relationship, and whether or not Doc is the right person for her.

Blow, Gabriel, Blow

Anything Goes

Blow, Gabriel, Blow is from *Anything Goes*, a musical with book by Guy Bolton and P. G. Wodehouse and music and lyrics by Cole Porter. Anything Goes follows the young broker Billy Crocker as he stows away on a cruise ship in hopes of courting the heiress Hope Harcourt, who is a passenger on the same ship. In this song, Billy's friend Reno, a nightclub singer, is restoring the mood after the passengers of the cruise ship discover they have been lied to by Billy in regards to his true identity.

Sunday is the Act I closer of the musical Sunday in the Park with George, by James Lapine with music and lyrics by Stephen Sondheim. This musical was inspired by the great French painter Georges Seurat and his journey to complete the famous painting A Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte. In Sunday, the park that is the setting of George's painting grows noisy. Multiple fights ensue until George takes control of the subjects, creating visual and musical harmony, ending in the tableau that is the final product of Georges Seurat's iconic painting.
